Life After Juliet is a companion book to Love and Other Unknown Variables by Shannon Lee Alexander. The first book was told from Becca's brother's POV and this one now tells Becca's story after the end of the first book. I haven't read Love and Other Unknown Variables myself but I do believe this one worked fine as a standalone novel and reading the first wasn't needed to truly understand this one. This book starts off with a rather somber beginning with Becca dealing with the loss of her best friend. It's highly emotional all the way through as she learns how to deal with her heartache and learn to make new friends and go on with life without Charlotte.
