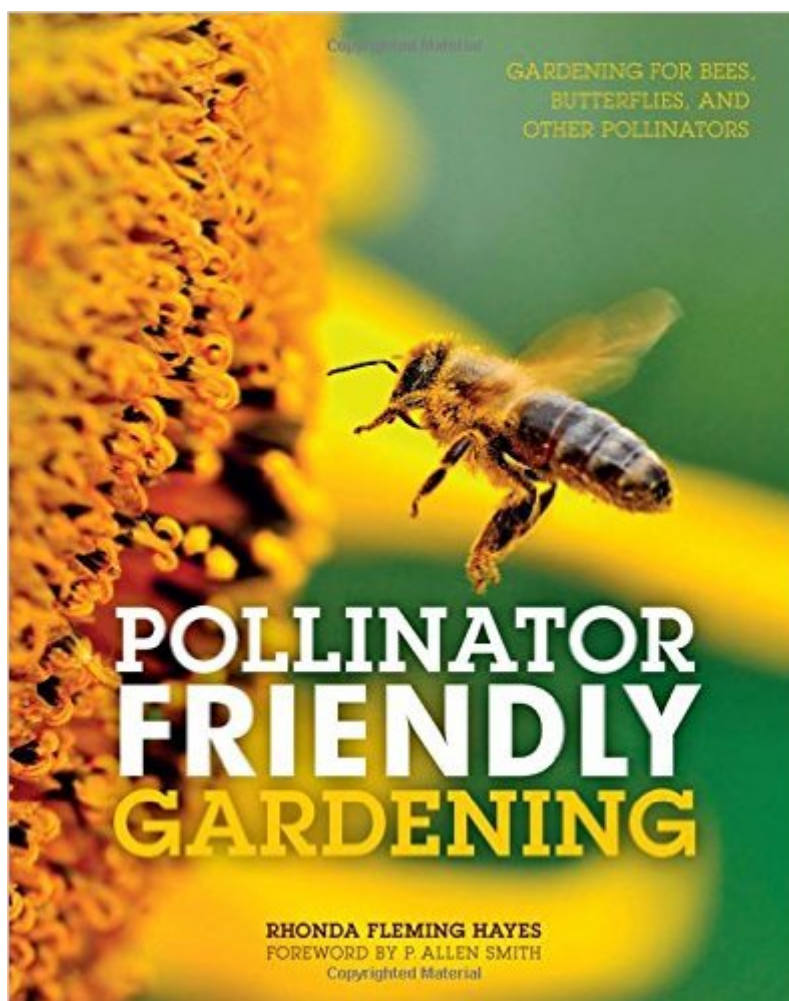

The photos are both informative and striking, and the text is formatted perfectly so the immense amount of well-researched material never seems daunting or academic. The Ask An Expert sections are great for more in-depth conversations on specific topics, but they are never dry or too professorial. The author clearly has a well-grounded grasp on the material, but is also an expert in conveying what could be incredibly dense information in a way that is fun, clear, concise, and most of all practical for any gardener no matter their gardening experience. She makes it easy to jump in as a beginner or enhance your own spaces as an advanced gardener.
